### What's New

Chiquita Canyon Landfill (CCL) held a “free disposal day” on Saturday, June 6, 2020, for residents of Val Verde and Castaic. The next upcoming free disposal day is Saturday, September 12, 2020. Each resident is allowed up to one-ton of disposal free of charge.

CCL is closely monitoring the current situation regarding COVID-19 and following guidance from the CDC, WHO, and our state and local public health officials. To help ensure your safety and the safety of our employees, CCL ask that residential garbage customers bag all trash before placing it in their container. The April 21 meeting of the CCL Community Advisory Committee (CAC) was cancelled due to COVID-19 restrictions and safety concerns. The Los Angeles County Department of Regional Planning will post a notice on their website

The County has indicated that the next CAC will be a virtual meeting with virtual public attendance.

CCL has completed construction of Cell 6 and began using the cell for waste disposal in April 2020.

### Regulatory and Permitting Activities

During the 2nd Quarter of 2020 (Q2; April through June), CCL continued coordination with regulatory agencies in support of necessary permits for ongoing expansion activities, including:

- Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, in support of a grading permit for CCL’s new entrance facilities
- Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, in support of a soil stockpile permit to facilitate new entrance construction
- Caltrans, in support of improvements along SR-126 required for CCL’s new entrance facilities
- California Department of Fish and Wildlife, in support of applications for Streambed Alteration Agreements under Section 1602 of the California Fish and Game Code for construction of Cell 8 and new entrance facilities
- Regional Water Quality Control Board, in support of application for Water Quality Certification under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act for construction of Cell 8 and new entrance facilities
- United States Army Corps of Engineers, in support of application for Nationwide Permit under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act for construction of Cell 8 and new entrance facilities
