### What's New

Chiquita Canyon Landfill (CCL) held a "free disposal day" on Saturday, September 7, 2019, for residents of Val Verde and Castaic. The next upcoming free disposal day is Saturday, December 7, 2019. Each resident is allowed up to one-ton of disposal free of charge.

CCL is currently constructing Cell 6, which will be used for waste disposal beginning in late 2019.

The Community Advisory Committee (CAC) has been established by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors. The first meeting of the CAC will be held on October 15th.

### Regulatory and Permitting Activities

During the 3rd Quarter of 2019 (Q3; July through September), CCL continued coordination with regulatory agencies in support of necessary permits for ongoing expansion activities, including:

- California Department of Fish and Wildlife, in support of applications for Streambed Alteration Agreements under Section 1602 of the California Fish and Game Code for construction of Cell 8 new entrance facilities
- Regional Water Quality Control Board, in support of application for Water Quality Certification under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act for Cell 8 construction
- United States Army Corps of Engineers, in support of application for Nationwide Permit under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act for Cell 8 construction

During Q3, CCL received the following permits or approvals for Cell 6 construction:

- Cell 6 Liner Construction Permit by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board

### Hotline and Emergency Log

In Q3, CCL received 3 isolated complaints for odor and no complaints for litter, noise, or fugitive dust. However, between September 4<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>, multiple complaints were received by the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD), resulting in CCL receiving 3 Notices of Violation (NOVs).
